The GFT Brochure has changed...

Why?

We are no longer able to programme films many weeks in advance. We are committed to providing the most up-to-date and correct information we can, to do this we must publish weekly instead of monthly. This is to avoid printing details of films, which then move release date, and no longer show at the advertised time. The weekly schedule allows us to be more flexible with the GFT programme, adding as well as removing titles where necessary.

GFT is a registered not-for-profit educational charity. Our self-generated income from cinema ticket sales, bars and private hire of our screens only covers 60% of the costs of running the GFT and our community projects. Moving to a more concise printed brochure, removing the grid, means we save a considerable amount of money each year and are able to continue to provide access programmes.

GFT is a member of the Green Arts Initiative. By producing a smaller, more concise brochure, we are reducing the amount of leftover print to be recycled.

What Now?

You can still pick up a GFT Brochure and see specific dates and times for all our special events and unique seasons, such as CineMasters.

You can find the dates New Releases are screening in the New Releases section of the brochure. Specific screening times will be available online from glasgowfilm.org, or in the relevant Weekly Schedule - available each Tuesday the week before - in the GFT foyer.

Where the date for a film states 'From', the film will be playing at GFT for at least one week.

For all times you can check glasgowfilm.org, pick up a Weekly Schedule, sign up to GFT Weekly Enewsletter, or call Box Office to hear recorded time listings for each day.
